The musical score offered to the performers is very limited. The musical composition lacks idiomatic character, imber, harmonic, melodic, and rhythmic challenges while demanding moderate variations of tempi. The visual staging does not align with the demands of the musical score. The musical score is incomplete and will limit scoring.	The musical score provides limited moments of quality and depth for winds and percussion. The musical composition occasionally allows a few levels of idiomatic character, timbre, harmonic, melodic and rhythmic challenges while demanding a few variations of tempi and visual staging. The performers usually exhibit an inconsistent approach to articulation, style, tone production, rhythmic accuracy, intonation, balance, musicianship and pulse/tempo. The performers have little or no training.	Performers seldom display proper tone production thus inhibiting a tonal center. Wind, brass and percussion instruments are not in tune and the ensemble has difficulties tuning vertical harmonic structures. Interval control problems are obvious in the melodic and counter melodic lines. Proper balance has not been achieved. Articulation is not properly approached with position of the tongue, thus creating distorted attacks and indecisive releases. Style is not consistent throughout the performance. Performers have a sense of rhythmic accuracy, pulse and tempo control, although at times this is challenging for them. The performers display very few levels of musical expression. Musical phrasing skills are in need of developing.	The performers usually exhibit a consistent approach to articulation, style, and awareness of pulse/tempo. However, these are inconsistent at times. Rhythm is moderately good. All performers exhibit good tone quality. However, brass, woodwind and percussion performers may be overtaxed beyond their ability to control the tone quality and timbre in both extended ranges and volumes. All instruments have been tuned, but there are still recognizable tuning errors. Harmonic structures are usually in tune. The performers are successful with proper balance. However, the performers display moments which interfere with a uniformity of blend. At times the performers display moderate achievement of uniformed musical expression. Musical phrasing skills are still developing.	Tone quality is properly produced throughout the most difficult passages and extreme registers. Breath support is maintained and tonal centers are rarely lost. Vertical and horizontal structures are always in tune. Melodic lines are accurate in regards to pitch. Proper balance is consistently displayed throughout the performance. Any flaws are minute and quickly corrected. The control of tempo, pulse and rhythm are exact and minor flaws are short in duration. Performers exhibit high levels of knowledge in respect to musicianship and style.	Performers exhibit tremendous levels of superior training, while having tremendous musical responsibilities. They show a full understanding of those responsibilities by displaying well defined style. This requires the highest level of mental and physical concentration. Their superior training has allowed their performance to be exceptional.
